Category Criteria

Fiscally Responsible Recognizes the need to structurally balance the City's budget while keeping the tax rate low and furthering economic growth and development.

Supports Government Collaboration Supports a plan to make government more efficient and effective, including expanding shared services practices, increasing regional leadership capacity, and exploring multi-jurisdictional revenue sharing.

Leadership Possesses the ability to take a position despite its controversial nature or unpopularity.
